Q2 Civil Disobedience movement shook the backbone of British administration? Analyse. [200W]

Ans →

Civil Disobedience movement started with dandi march by Gandhiji on April 6, 1930 when he broke the salt law.

The main reason of the movement was the denial of Gandhiji's eleven demands.

The backbone of British administration was 'shooked' due to the following reasons

- i) Foreign cloth and liquor shops were boycotted by people, it made the huge loss economically.
- ii) No-tax payment movements were held in Bihar for anti-chawki-darshan.
- iii) No-revenue, no-rent movements were prevalent in the whole

- w) The lawyers gave up their practice and civil servants also resigned. This also led to a loss to the British administration.
- v) The salt tax which was 8.2% was critically boycotted by the 'SALT SATYAGRAHA' in many parts of country such as Tamil Nadu led by Rajgopalchari, Gujarat → Dandi March led by Gandhiji.
- Moreover, the movement was concluded after the Gandhi-Grinin Pact, that included the demands of Gandhiji.
- However, this Civil Disobedience movement financially, economically hindered the British administration due to non payment of taxes, rents and revenues in the whole country.
