Ans. 'Mahandas Karamchand Gandhi' or 'Bapu' is known as the 'father of the nation' because of his contribution in the struggle of freedom, his non-violent ways, and his Satyagrah and peaceful ways are the most famous tools that he used to fight against the British Raj. He led a no. of movements for the Independence of India -

1. Champaran Satyagrah - Bihar - 1917
2. Kheda Satyagrah - Gujarat - 1918
3. Ahmedabad strike - Gujarat - 1918
4. Non Cooperation movement - 1920
5. Civil disobedience movement - 1930
6. Quit India movement - 1942

Gandhiji led all these movements, ~~and~~ with this he did a lot of work for the upliftment of 'Harijans' and to get rights for Harijans. In order to give election rights to Harijans Gandhi signed 'Poona Pact' with B. R. Ambedkar (by increasing seats) in 1932.

Gandhiji also participated in the Second round table conference held in 1931, as a representative of INC.

He got support from all over India and was also trusted by them.

Gandhiji facd opposition when he called off the 'non cooperation' movement when he made the decision without consulting Congress working committee. He also ~~also~~ faced opposition when he started 'Quit India movement' and gave the slogan of 'Do or die'.

Gandhiji was the most prominent leader in the struggle of Indian Independence who lead masses, launched movements, did satyagrah and hunger strikes. His contribution in writing India and Harijans is one of the ^{most} 26.5 CM important work done by him. He was a peace lover and wanted independence without violence but during Quit India movement he asked the country men to 'do or die' for the nation's independence.
