1.	<u>Gulletting</u> → Gulletting When the demand for grants is passed without debate & discussion its c/d Gulletting.		
2.	Token Cut - When the demand for grants is passed but grants is reduced by Rs 100/- it's called token cut.		
3.	PAC - Public accounts committee. - Its financial committee of parliament. - <u>Members</u> - 22, 15 from LS & 7 from RS. - <u>Functions</u> - It examines the audit report of CAG and asks explanation from concerned authority for the objection raised by CAG. It carries out financial scrutiny. - <u>Criticism</u> - Its role is neither preventive nor curative but just post mortem. Lacks specialisation.		

→ Delegated Legislation

→ The legislation passed by parliament is usually outlined and bureaucrats fills the inner details based on their requirements and ground so it is known as delegated legislation.

→ Advantages -

- Saves time of parliament
- Based on specialisation
- Decentralisation
- Team spirit b/w executive & legislature
- Reduces burden of parliament

→ Disadvantage -

- Gives more power to executive
- Hampers sovereignty of parliament
- Hide shortcoming of parliament
