Que. - Should India adopt to presidential form of government?

Ans - India since independence follows parliamentary form of government which provides the citizens of India with enormous power to reach out to the system of governance and participate as well.

The presidential form of government can somewhat raise certain delicate issues, such as:

- ⇒ Increase dictatorship.
- ⇒ Less progressive in terms of checks & balances.
