Q) what were the factors that led to industrial revolution? Discuss the social and political effect of industrial revolution on the world.

⇒ Factors responsible for the beginning of Industrial Revolution are

① Invention of steam engine = invention of steam engine by Thomas Newcomen and later modified by James Watt boosted the production process by giving required electric power to machines.



② Gas lighting = it increased the night life of cities and helped industries to work in nights also.

③ Devil's lamp = it helped in deeper mining as miners had to face problems due to methane gas.

④ Transportation = improved transportation facilities through water, road and railway helped reach far off places.

⑤ Coal = use of coal for burning instead of wood and charcoal helped
