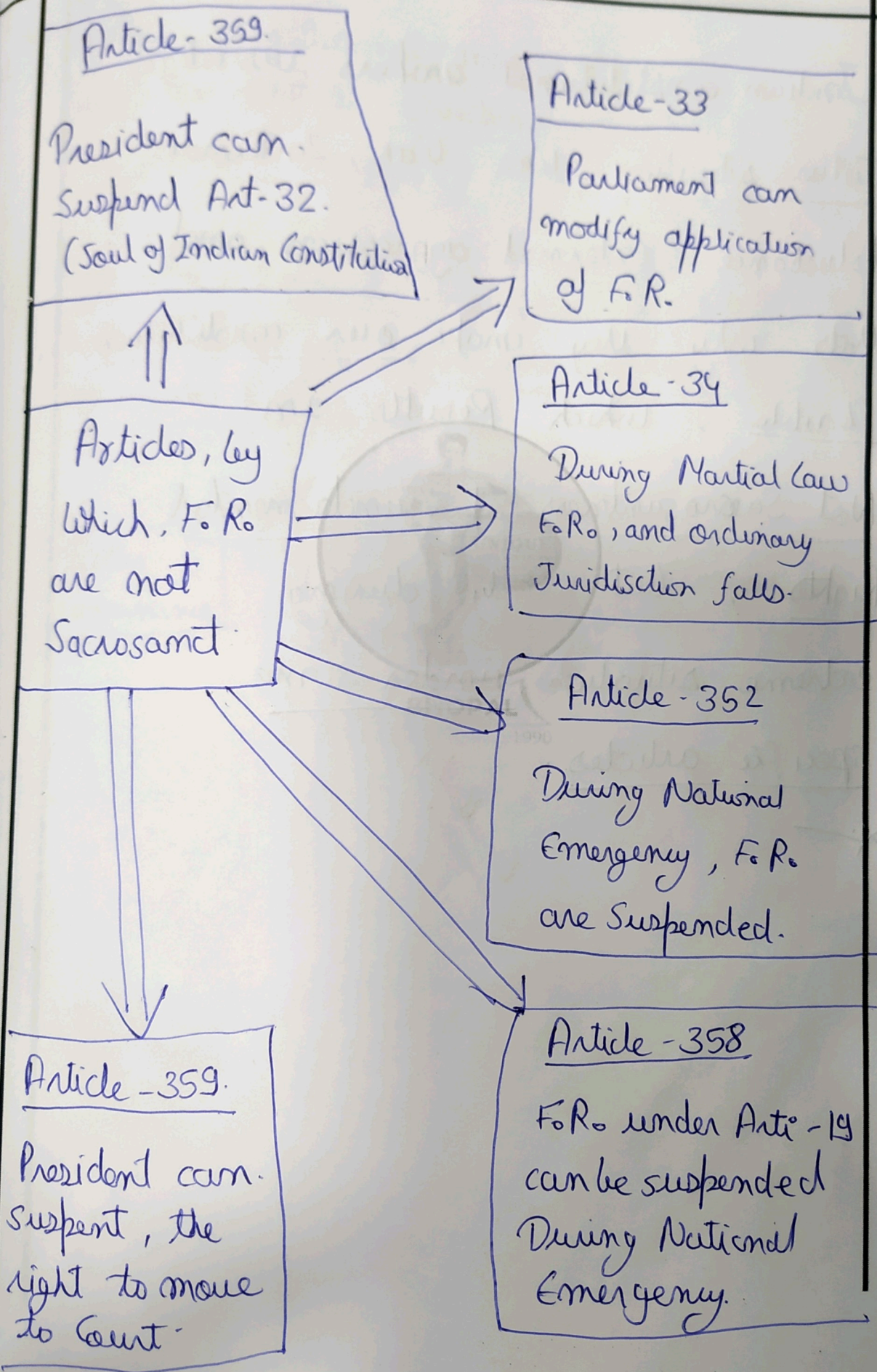
Ans: → Fundamental Rights:
