

① Tribunals on one hand speedily solve the disputes on other hand are against the rule of law. Analysis (250)

Tribunals are the branch of judiciary, in which work is shared by the executive & the expert of the respected field  
eg; NCT, Military tribunal, Ganga tribunal

Tribunals help in speedily solving the issue in following way;

(i) Expertise panel :- A tribunal consist of judicial members along with experts of the field, which helps in solving disputes more faster.

(ii) Remove Pendency :- Helps in removing pendency of the cases from the judicial system  
- over 58,519 pending cases in India

- (iii) Co-ordination between judiciary and executive - It helps in bringing Co-ordination between the judiciary & executive by working together to solve disputes.
- (iv) Bring transparency in the judicial process.

However, tribunals are said to be against the Rule of law. Let us see why;

- (i) Violate the fundamental of equality before law as per article 14, for different ~~but~~ matters different tribunals set up like military matters in military tribunals.
- (ii) It is also against the doctrine of separation of powers, as executive is encroaching the judiciary.

(iii) It is also against the supremacy of law, which states 'law is supreme not person'

Tribunals play a key role in solving the cases faster, but in India rule of law should be maintained, so that proper judiciary, and judiciary will be kept free from impartiality and away from external influence.
