


Q: What is ZBNF? What are its advantages & shortcomings?

Ans: Zero Budget Natural Farming (ZBNF) - A chemical-free agriculture practice focused in doubling the farmers income.

Also,

- It is a method of farming where the cost of growing and harvesting plants is zero
- Farmers need not purchase fertilizers & pesticides
- Farmers use
 - Earthworms
 - Cow dung
 - Urine
 - plant
 - human excreta
- ZBNF is an alternative to commercial farming
- Popularity gained especially in
 - i) Karnataka
 - ii) Andhra Pradesh.



Advantages of ZBNF :

1. End reliance on loans and production costs.
ultimately ending the cycle of debt on farmers
2. Replaces fertilizers & pesticides → Organic inputs
to increase soil fertility.
3. the adoption of mulching has reduced the loss of moisture content from soil , which has lead to increase in a) soil aeration
b) soil health
c) soil fertility
4. In wake of climate change this method is useful because uses resilient agriculture

Shortcomings of ZBNF

1. Farmers aren't equipped with proper training & equipments.
2. Availability of Indian breed cow is declining at a fast pace , which is needed for its dung & urine
3. Sikkim has seen some decline in production while following organic farming

4. While preserving soil quality, ZBNF has very low pace effect in boosting productivity.

Until and unless these shortcomings are not resolved doubling farmer's productivity & income will remain imaginary, despite being environment friendly
