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Ques. The Right of children to free and compulsory Education act 2009, remains inadequate in promoting incentive based system for childrens education without generating awareness about the importance of Schooling.. Analyze.

Ans. The Right to education act, 2009 ensures free and compulsory education for children aged 6-14. However, it lacks focus on incentives and awareness, limiting its effectiveness.

Inadequacies of the Act :-

lack of awareness campaigns :-

There is insufficient focus on sensitizing parents, especially in rural and marginalized communities, about the long-term benefits of education.

No Direct incentives for Parents :-

The Act does not provide adequate financial or material incentives (subsidies) to poor families to encourage regular attendance of their children.

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Mid-day meal scheme not fully integrated:-

while mid-day meals exists, they are not directly part of the RTE Act framework, which could have made it more attractive for children and parents. ✓

low focus on Retention:-

emphasis is on enrollment, not on keeping children in school. ✓

No student rewards :-

There are no structured rewards for students based on attendance, performance or progression, which could motivate continued participation.

limited teacher role in motivation :-

Teachers are not trained or incentivized to promote schooling as a life-changing tool within communities.

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without incentives and awareness, The RTE act falls short of its full potential. more community engagement and support systems are needed.
